 an awareness of and exposure to the natural environment. Programs will be adapted to meet the needs of each
 student based on age, abilities, and interest level.
- Provide school wide in-services, PTA Programs and Community workshops to increase awareness of the value of the horticultural therapy program
- Design, maintain, and update garden areas to be used as an outdoor classroom. The design will focus on providing a safe environment that will encourage a variety of sensory and learning experiences.
- Collaborate with Director of Development and Marketing as requested to support funding requests for both the indoor and outdoor components of the program.
- Maintain financial records pertaining to the operation of the HT Program
- Partner closely with the teachers, staff, specialists, and families to support the needs and goals of the students.
 Provide recommendations regarding landscaping decisions, including design, material selection and maintenance of the school campus.
- Responsible for procuring any necessary plants, soil, amendments, and mulch needed to maintain the garden
